Frankenwriting

Now that you've completed the team research and presented your conclusions, you are to take one main point from the body (**analysis, not introduction**) and fully develop it, using textual evidence from the primary source and weaving in support from two to three different secondary sources. Your goal is to present a written snapshot of your ability to synthesize sources to create a unified, coherent, and fully developed point from your thesis.

Requirements:

- Fully develop your chosen analysis point; break down into subpoints and list the supporting details you will use. (Will be more than one paragraph!).
- Use at least three pieces of supporting textual evidence from the <u>primary source</u>.
- Use supporting details from at least two to three <u>secondary sources</u>.
- Weave them together into a strong, supportive tapestry where your writing provides the foundational threads that hold everything together. To use another analogy, your words are the cookie dough that binds all the ingredients together into a well-balanced cookie. Be careful to spread the chips and nuts out—don't clump them all together!
- Use MLA format to document internally everything you borrow from a source, whether you quote directly, paraphrase, or summarize.
- Include a separate page for your list of Works Cited. Follow all MLA formatting requirements.
- Use the "literary present" tense.
- Use power verbs. NO expletives or passive voice! (5 pts. off score for each occurrence!)

Thesis Statement: (Write your team's thesis statement.)

Begin the body paragraph with a topic sentence that presents the main point you are developing.

Develop this main point and all its subpoints fully, using the primary and secondary sources!
